It's lunchtime in the playground, but it's never a fun time for Zoe. Charlie is always there to hurt her.



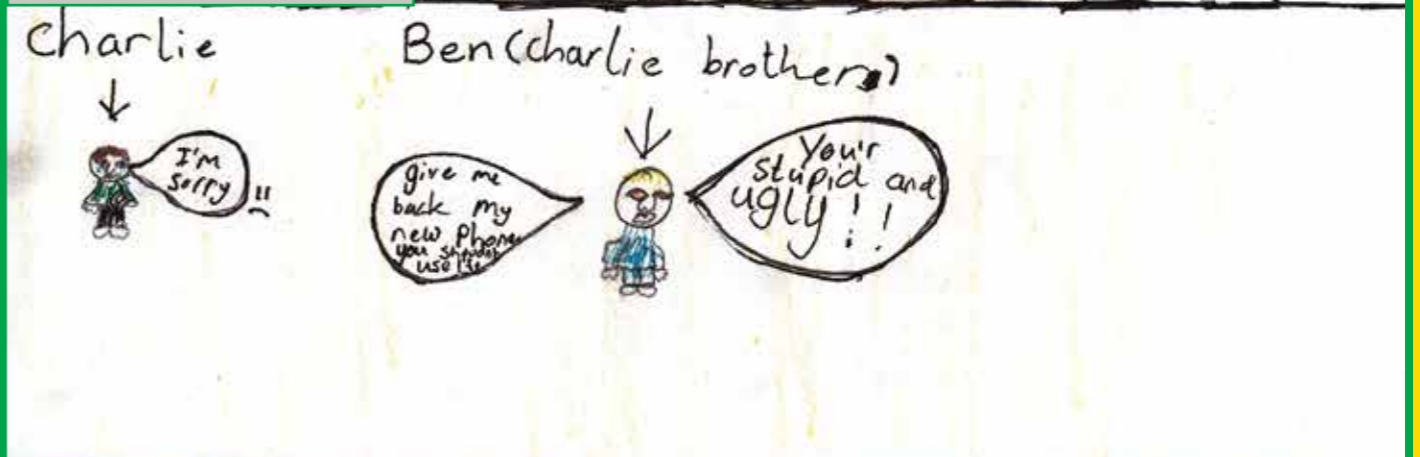
He's always there, even outside of school.

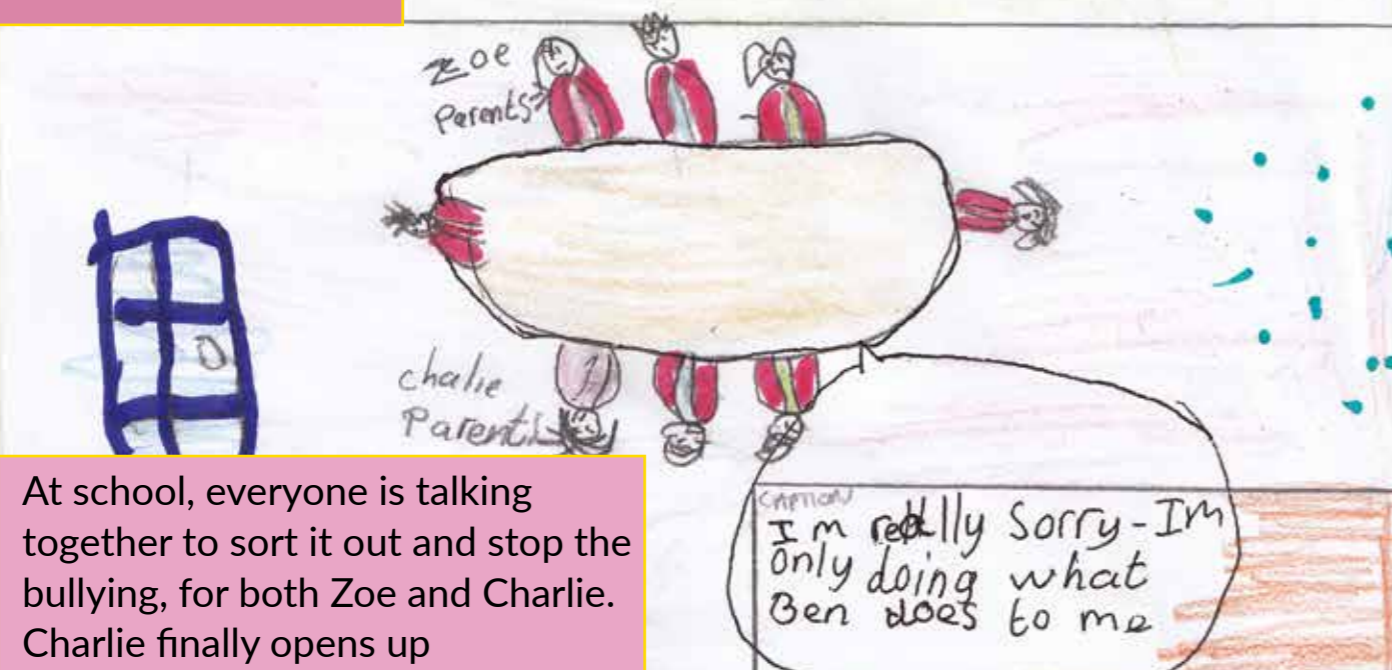


Zoe can't take any more. She finally feels brave enough to tell her parents before going to school the next day.
