Cold Homes can cost lives

On Average, 12,000 people die each year from health conditions arising or worsening from having a cold home. Between 2019 and 2020 there were estimated 26,500 excess winter deaths, nearly half of these were attributed cold homes. What are excess winter deaths? Well, excess winter deaths are defined by the Office for National Statistics as “the difference between the number of deaths during the four winter months (December to March) and the average number of deaths during the preceding August to November and the following April to July”. This is why services like the Green Doctor are trying to raise awareness of the issue and trying to help people stay warm and healthy throughout the winter. There are various reports that say how bad things can be throughout winter but also how money, when invested in the right places can help dramatically. For example, the figures from National Energy Action's Strategy 2021 guide state:

- Hospitalisation for COPD is 4 times more likely in winter months
- Cold homes cost the NHS more than £2billion each year
- Every £ spent on making homes warmer brings £4 of health benefits

This shows that making homes warmer is not only better for the individuals living in the homes, but also for the country as a whole. Let's hope that the COP26 Summit helps to get things going in the right direction and focuses the governments minds on issues like fuel poverty and cold homes as well as helping the environment.

Last year Cadent and Groundwork came together to compile and distribute 2700 winter warmer packs for those most in need. The packs were distributed via local food banks and community hubs across the North West, West Midlands, East of England and North London.
