| Copeland Borough Council | Round 5 Main Round | The project will improve visitor infrastructure, facilities and activities along Cumbria's 'hidden' coast, aiming to create new visitor demand and increase sustainable local employment opportunities. Sections of the trail will be available all year round and supported by illustrated maps, signage and digital media. | Torrige District Council | Round 5 Main Round | The project will create an interpretation centre and activity hub for nature-based tourism on Northam Burrows.
