At Groundwork NE & Cumbria we are passionate about creating a future where every neighbourhood is thriving; community is strong and no-one is held back.





Employability

Supporting the most vulnerable into employment

Through our Building Better Opportunities (BBO) and other employability programmes; Groundwork proudly work in partnership to deliver vital employment services across the North; Reaching Out Across Durham (ROAD), CHOICES Cumbria, Moving on Tyne and Wear, Step Forward Tees Valley and Restart. We proudly supported over 1,500 vulnerable and isolated adults facing multiple and complex needs, into employment, education, training or active job searching.

STEP FORWARD TEES VALLEY

Supporting unemployed people across Tees Valley with mental health, isolation, digital exclusion and employment, with fantastic achievements.















Youth Employment Initiative (YEI)



Groundwork is proud to have supported over **350** young people to learn and achieve. Our specialist youth employability workers and careers advisors have inspired confidence; enabling young people to take control of their destiny for a more prosperous future. Supporting them into education, work or training, boosting regional productivity.

Our YEIs deliver through Tees Valley Pathways, DurhamWorks and Northern Directions.

KICKSTART

Funded work placements for young people aged 16–24 years old on Universal Credit. Groundwork successfully started 250 placements with 90 local businesses. 63 Kickstarter's gained full time employment.

When Bradley first started he struggled with confidence, social skills and anxiety. After receiving dedicated support from Groundwork he became motivated to gain the skills and training he needed to find employment; building his confidence, CV and interview skills. Bradley is now undertaking training and accreditation to develop a career in warehousing & distribution.

WEST CUMBRIA MENTAL HEALTH PARTNERSHIP

This partnership connects people with a range of vital mental health support services in Allerdale and Copeland. Groundwork leads the adult services partnership, supporting people who may be struggling with anxiety, depression or other issues which are having an impact on their mental health and wellbeing. The partnership is so grateful for its funding through Sellafield Ltd and the 'Transforming West Cumbria' grant, managed by Cumbria Community Foundation.









Holiday Activities, Tackling Food Inequality

Food insecurity is increasing rapidly; especially during school holidays and in the North

HOLIDAY ACTIVITIES PROGRAMMES

The provision of free holiday activities and healthy food during the school holidays is one of our ways to help the growing issue of food poverty and inequality felt across the region. We provide over 250 educational and environmental activity sessions; supporting over 3,800 children and adults by providing over 3,200 meals.


Kai's Story

Despite leaving school at 16 with no GCSEs, hanging around with the wrong crowd and finding himself in trouble with the police, Kai has changed his life around.

"That summer my Mam pushed me to do NCS. We had to run our own community project and I helped raise donations for a local children's hospital ward. It put a new perspective on life and I continued volunteering."

A couple of years on Kai didn't look back and became a seasonal staff member for NCS helping other young people to take on new challenges, build skills and give back to the community.

Now aged 21, Kai's started a role with housing provider *Home Group*, providing mental health support for young people in care.



I tell youths I work with to search 'Gateshead boy kicked out of school' on the internet, I'm the first result and I try to use my story to help keep them on the right path.

TEES SCULPTURE TRAIL

As part of Groundwork's River Tees Initiative; proudly supported by Tees Valley Combined Authority, the Tees Sculpture Trail installed 25 inspiring sculptures along the Teesdale Way created by 5 local artists. The trail includes guidebooks and a 'passport' showcasing sculptures that depict local heritage along the iconic route.

This has developed even stronger pride of place, sense of identify and community.









LAND OF OAK & IRON HERITAGE CENTRE

Set in the beautiful Derwent Valley in Gateshead with an abundance of natural woodland, iconic wildlife and hidden heritage of world leading iron and steel industry. We are proud to support local suppliers and artisans in our café and shop as well as hosting a wide range of events and activities from seasonal children's trails and holiday activities, to live music, creative workshops and heritage talks.



Green Recovery Challenge Fund









NORTON 'POCKETS OF NATURE' PARTNERSHIP

Stockton secured Green Recovery Challenge funding with the aim of creating better neighbourhoods for both people and wildlife, while building skills and job prospects for people in the area.

Neglected and underdeveloped habitats were restored using community engagement, volunteers and employment of 12 local young people. Storm damage and local beauty spots benefitted from positive community effort and environmental awareness.











REVITALISING OUR ESTUARIES (RoE)


Innovative river estuary restoration that responds to the climate and biodiversity crisis. Working with **over 100 organisations** to improve river estuaries across the North East for people, businesses and wildlife - helping our rivers to thrive once more.

Our coastal environments and communities have been significantly affected by climate change, litter, pollution, flooding and deindustrialisation. They need environmental and economic support to restore water quality, improve habitats and protect species whilst creating green jobs.

This partnership programme has enabled us to reintroduce the salt marsh at Hebburn; one of the most effective habitats for absorbing carbon dioxide from the atmosphere.









Cleaning Our Waters and Tackling the Climate and Biodiversity Emergency

THE WILD OYSTER PROJECT

More than 1,000 oysters have been reintroduced to the North East coast by Groundwork and partners in a bid to rebuild the species and improve the health of coastal waters. The shellfish - which are dubbed 'superheroes of the sea' - filter out pollutants.

One adult oyster can filter 200 litres of seawater every day removing nitrates from sewage spills and fertiliser.

1,300 oysters in bespoke nurseries in Sunderland and Blyth marinas have been installed. These will attract other marine life and create rich habitats.

Gaby's Story

After graduating with a 2:1 BSC in Marine Biology and studying during Covid lockdowns, Gaby struggled to find a job due to her lack of experience.

The Kickstart Scheme offered an opportunity as a Research Assistant at Groundwork. Here she monitored the impact of Groundwork NE & Cumbria's flagship 'Revitalising our Estuaries' programme and lead the publication of the trust's first report and action plan, with targets to be carbon neutral by 2030.

Gaby's work proved invaluable leading to a new full time role at Groundwork.

Gaby is excited about her role being made permanent, she can't wait to take on more responsibility and progress in her job.

Helping to Reduce Environmental Impact and Fight Climate Change

GROUNDWORK GREEN DOCTOR service provides energy efficiency experts who visit people in their homes across the North East & Cumbria, helping vulnerable households to save money and stay warm and well. With over 1 in 10 households in the UK experiencing fuel poverty, it's a crucial lifeline for many residents helping to reduce inequality and support those most in need.

Green Doctor helps people engage with the climate emergency and save money at the same time. The need for and success of this programme means we are actively training and integrating more Green Doctor advisors into wider Groundwork programmes, to reach more people in need, such as Employment and Youth programmes.

CARBON LITERACY TRAINING

Groundwork, in partnership with the Carbon Literacy Project, is proud be an accredited Carbon Literacy training provider. Educating staff and apprentices through environmental training in climate change awareness, energy efficiency and the climate impacts of everyday life and work.

Groundwork has committed to train all staff, trainees and apprentices in 2022 and roll out Carbon Literacy Training to our supply chain, partners, schools and groups. This supports our goal to be carbon neutral by 2030; leading the field as an ethical environmental and community charity.

Participants really value the Carbon Literacy Certificate on their CV, many becoming climate champions in their workplaces and communities.







Delivering Nature Based Solutions Creating Green Jobs

LOFTUS COMMUNITY WOODLAND


Groundwork's expert Landscape Architects Team and Green Team ranger apprentices have created an innovative natural flood management scheme. This included opening up an underground stream and pond to create a beautiful new wetland habitat. Many wildlife species have returned after years of absence and deer have already been seen. The ranger team have also installed a new pedestrian bridge to give the local community better access to nature.

Thanks to the Green Recovery Challenge Fund; Environmental Rangers have delivered fantastic Nature Based Solutions and woodland restoration. Improving access to nature, green spaces, training and employability for young people.
