### **GREEN DOCTOR**

Groundwork's Green Doctors help Yorkshire residents stay warm, stay well, and save money on household bills.



With over 1 in 10 households in the UK experiencing fuel poverty, it's a crucial lifeline for many residents. The service provides energy efficient experts, helping to reduce inequality and support those most in need.

- 4,200 visits and calls completed
- 9,660 clients supported
- £414,695 lifetime savings worth of energy saving measures provided
- **→** Carbon savings = 968,284 Kg CO2e
- 3,629 emergency fuel payments issued, worth £322,779

#### CASE STUDY

#### Kirklees Resident

A resident contacted the Green
Doctor team as they were
struggling to use the storage
heaters in their home; They rarely
turned their heating on due to the
high costs of running them. During a
visit, the Green Doctor explained




how storage heaters work, the function of each control, and how best to set these controls throughout the year.

On inspecting the resident's property, the Green Doctor identified that they had incandescent lightbulbs fitted and the hot water cylinder was not insulated. The Green Doctor helped to replace five lightbulbs, fitting energy efficient LED bulbs. They also fitted a hot water cylinder jacket, making a significant saving on their electricity bill.

As part of the follow-up call, the Green Doctor found the resident was struggling to top up their meter. The team then issued a £49 fuel voucher to help keep them warm.

### RETROFIT

## How to get a warmer, more comfortable and energy efficient home

As part of Green Doctor, we provide retrofit services and energy efficiency reports for domestic dwellings and community buildings.

Retrofitting is the process of making improvements to your home so it becomes more energy efficient with lower emissions. Our Retrofit Assessors, along with independent qualified professionals, assess the property and produce a bespoke plan that matches a budget for work that can be carried out in stages. Working on all tenures and from Government funded schemes to the able-to-pay market.






#### **CASE STUDY**

#### Sheffield City Council Local Authority Delivery 2 Project (LAD2)

Our retrofit team worked in partnership with Sheffield City Council to reach a C rating EPC for 100s of properties across the Sheffield region. We were instructed to complete retrofit assessments, full Trustmark coordination and post EPCs on Sheffield council housing stock.

Measures for the project:

+ Loft insulation

- + Solar Panels
- + Cavity Wall insulation
- + Upgraded Ventilation

The team worked in partnership with Equans & Michael Dysons Associates to complete over 200 Retrofit Assessments. We were also instructed to model measure packages to make sure full compliance and targets were met for the project.

The homes are now more energy efficient, warmer, better ventilated and have means of producing their own electricity via solar panels, reducing energy bills.

Staffed by Chartered Landscape Architects, the team is dedicated to delivering imaginative and innovative design solutions to meet clients' needs.

#### **REIN PARK**

The team worked at Rein Park in Seacroft, Leeds to improve the play area and create a pump track for the community.

The installed play area was complimented by a tree and bulb planting scheme to link the different areas. **14 Birch trees** were planted and large swaths of daffodil and snowdrop bulbs, helping to improve **608m<sup>2</sup> of land**.

We also worked alongside Leeds City Council and the LS14 Trust to develop and deliver the Rein Park Pump Track in Seacroft, Leeds. It was funded by Section 106 money and improved 1,300m<sup>2</sup> of land in the park.

The all-weather tarmac course is complimented by a drainage system on this traditionally very wet site. The track has been a huge hit in the local community and complements other facilities in the park.











#### **MORLEY TOWNS DEAL**

After the successful Towns Fund Bid to central government, Morley secured £24.3m to deliver projects to transform the town. Part of this funding has been earmarked for the greener and connected programme which includes:

- **⊘** The development of eight parks
- The redesign and upgrade of a number of pocket parks
- **Setter facilities for pedestrians and cyclists**
- **⊘** Improved connections to the rail station
- Minproving the civic space around the Grade I listed Morley Town Hall All projects will be completed by March 2026

Our Landscape Architects are leading on the delivery of the first three of these projects. Masterplans were developed for eight parks to help secure the funding and these are being further consulted upon, detailed and delivered in phases over the next four years.

The project so far, has been very well received by the client and residents and several consultation events have taken place to inform the proposals, both online and face to face. Final plans were produced in partnership with the Council and the Greener and Connected Sub Group for 2022/23 for the first two of these parks, Hembrigg and Dartmouth Parks, as well as proposals for Magpie Lane pocket park.









#### **DYNAMIC DRAINS**

Groundwork Hull's Dynamic Drains project has been running for three years in partnership with Hull City Council, Yorkshire Wildlife Trust and Environment Agency. The project aims to increase biodiversity along the man-made three and a half mile stretch of the Beverley and Barmston Drain. The team also work to improve the water quality, engage the local community in nature and collective action to address issues such as littering and fly tipping.















#### **GROUNDWORK PRIDE LIMITED**

Groundwork Pride is our landscape contracting subsidiary specialising in delivering minor civil, soft and hard landscaping contracts throughout Yorkshire including maintenance, invasive species treatment and landscape creation. GPL predominantly work with major housing developers, local authorities and other public bodies.

#### FRYSTON, FRICKLEY AND RABBIT INGS

Our Countryside Rangers manage over 217 hectares of Land Trust owned, open space to enhance the local wildlife and provide spaces and events for communities. The land covers Fryston Country Trails, Frickley Country Park and Rabbit Ings Country Park.

The Land Trust monitor the site management and use, based on five key performance indicators; community cohesion, economy, education, environment and health. With these in mind the rangers work to enhance the natural environment and engage the community in various events throughout the year.

#### **GOLF**

Groundwork Golf is a wholly owned trading subsidiary of Groundwork Yorkshire. It comprises two operational golf courses – **Whitwood Golf Course**, a 9-hole golf and footgolf course in Wakefield; and **Springhead Park Golf Course**, an 18-hole golf course and coffee shop in west Hull.

Both courses have a club membership, but also provide a pay and play offer, helping to make golf available to the wider community.

Healthy Holidays is important to ensure that children can access a hot, healthy meal and fun activities throughout school holidays. It allows them to come to our sessions without fear of judgement, exclusion or prejudice.

#### **WEST YORKSHIRE**

During school holidays, we ran a Healthy Holiday programme for families living in the **Morley South and Ardsley** and **Robin Hood**Wards of Leeds. The programme provided outdoor activities and healthy food which families help prepare, cook, then share together.

A separate summer programme was delivered in Bradford for children attending **Academy at St James**. This programme focused on forest school activities and was a first for the school.

#### **EAST RIDING OF YORKSHIRE**

**Go Wild Goole** ran throughout August 2022 at West Park, Goole. A structured educational programme focusing on the environment, nature and health. The scheme was funded by the Healthy Holidays scheme, targeting children entitled to free school meals.

#### LADYPIT LANE ALLOTMENT

We run weekly sessions at our community allotment in Beeston, Leeds, providing support to seven core members of the local community. The allotment provides a safe space for its members, giving them a chance to **socialise** and learn some **new skills**. The project aims to increase fitness and mobility, improving mental well-being and growing healthy, fresh food which is enjoyed together and taken home.



#### **COOKING ON A BUDGET**

Funded by Tesco, these one-off sessions teach participants how to cook cost effective, family friendly meals and explore budgeting. The sessions are flexible in audience and have been delivered across the region to a wide range of organisations including schools, rainbow, beavers, community centres and church groups.

#### THE MORLEY SHED

The Morley Shed is open to those aged 40 and over. It is a fully equipped wood workshop open to all abilities.



The Shed is more than just a workshop, it helps bring people together; tackling **mental health** and loneliness by providing a space to **socialise**. It's a great place to share skills and knowledge, or just have a cup of tea and a biscuit and spend time with likeminded others. The Shed currently had over **60 active members** and is open over **200 days** across the year.



#### WARM SPACE AND COMMUNITY PANTRY

Our warm space and pantry sessions were held every Thursday afternoon and Friday morning throughout winter in our Morley reception area. Sessions were scheduled as a co-ordinated local response with other local organisations to maximise the offer to the local community. Over the season we saw a significant increase in the amount of people using the space and purchasing items from the pantry. While some users came in just for a friendly cuppa and chat, others accessed it due to cost of living pressures.

"It's so hard trying to make money stretch to cover the basics. I'm on a basic pension and after buying little food, there is precious little left. I like to think I am good with money, but there is not a lot you can do when the bills have gone up and some of them have tripled."

#### **CORPORATE SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY (CSR)**

We work with various organisations on their CSR, offering tailor made packages to help make a positive impact on communities. We help site hosts, organisations and volunteers every step of the way to plan and run a CSR day. We have various sites to choose from, suitable for different group sizes.



#### **GRANT MANAGEMENT**

As a trusted partner our experienced grant management team helps to support thousands of projects every year through our grant programmes, ensuring money gets to where it's most needed.









612 Tesco Community Grants were issued across the region



40 Comic Relief Grants were issued across the region equating to £314,164



ESF grant programme ended with a total of 238 groups supported and funded in West Yorkshire across the duration of the programme

#### **GREEN GUARDIANS**

The Green Guardians project was funded for a second year via the Housing Advisory Panels in seven areas of Leeds. We improved 134 gardens which were referred to us after being deemed unsafe or overgrown due to tenant vulnerabilities. The project prevents enforcement action, significantly improves the physical appearance of the local communities, and improves wellbeing of the tenants.

#### **ARDSLEY WELLNESS WALKS**

A series of monthly themed guided walks were delivered around Ardsley Reservoir, targeted at people from the local area who were affected by; low level mental and physical health issues, social isolation, post-Covid anxiety or a lack of exercise and time spent outdoors. Referrals came from many sources including local GP practices, social prescribers and patient groups.

#### **COMMUNITY FRIDGE**

The Groundwork **Community Fridge**, based at **Springhead Park Golf Club**, works with local businesses to source fresh foods that might otherwise go to waste and make them available to residents of Hull who are struggling to cope with the current economic crisis.

Our **Tea Time Club** supports families, providing an affordable meal for adult members of the family and free meal for children.

#### THE SHED, HULL

As part of our strive to be sustainable, our Hull communities' team manages the Community Repaint Scheme for Hull and Humber. The project works with local businesses to divert viable, high quality paint for various uses from landfill. The paint is then sold at just £2 per litre to individuals, community groups, schools and anyone that is looking for paint.



4,507 litres of paint collected, with 3,316 litres redistributed into the local community

### **PEOPLE**

#### **GROUNDWORK LEARNING CENTRE**



Classes in Digital Skills, Arts and Crafts, Creative Wellbeing, Family History and Employment Support have taken place throughout the academic year.



Over 200 sessions delivered



70 adults attending per week



#### **GREEN SKILLS**

Our Green Skills programme is targeted at unemployed adults, aged 19 plus, to gain a range of green skills, enabling them to find employment. Each course ran for 12 full days and participants achieved Level 1 Horticulture Certificate, LANTRA Brush Cutter qualification and a CSCS qualification. The programme has been delivered in York, Sheffield, Sherburn-in-Elmet and Selby.

### **PEOPLE**

#### **ALTERNATIVE CURRICULUM**

A targeted programme for young people in Year 9, run over six full days, on local green space. The students undertake a range of work experience within horticulture, achieving a NOCN Level 1 Horticulture Certificate. We have delivered to schools in Selby, Tadcaster, Sherburn-in-Elmet, York, Northallerton and Scarborough.

#### **OUTDOOR WOODLAND LEARNING**

Outdoor Woodland Learning is a programme of outdoor learning for children aged five to 10, based in nature. Our fully qualified green leaders provide a fun, educational and safe environment for learning.
