

Privacy Notice for Go Wild Goole 2024

How your information will be used

1. Innogy Wind Farm and HAF East Riding are funding Groundwork Yorkshire to provide the Go Wild Goole Summer playscheme in 2024.
2. Groundwork Yorkshire is collecting your data as part of this programme.
3. When you provide us with your personal details, these may be shared with our funders, but they will not be shared with any other third parties.
4. When you provide us with your personal details, we may contact you in future to advise you about future playschemes in Goole.
5. Groundwork Yorkshire is a charity working locally and nationally to transform lives in the UK's most disadvantaged communities, and we may sometimes need to process your data to pursue our legitimate business. The nature of our legitimate interests are to provide services and support to disadvantaged communities. We will never process your data where these interests are overridden by your own interests.
6. All of the information we hold will have been provided by you.
7. Where we process special categories of information relating to your racial or ethnic origin, political opinions, religious and philosophical beliefs, trade union membership, biometric data or sexual orientation, we will always obtain your explicit consent to those activities unless this is not required by

law or the information is required to protect your health in an emergency.

8. Where we are processing data based on your consent, you have the right to withdraw that consent at any time.
9. Other than as mentioned above, we will only disclose information about you to third parties if we are legally obliged to do so.
10. Your personal data will not be transferred outside of the EEA or to an international organisation.
11. We do not use automated decision making (including profiling).
12. Your personal data will be stored for a period of 6 years following the end of the project named above.
13. If in the future we intend to process your personal data for a purpose other than that which it was collected we will provide you with information on that purpose and any other relevant information.

Your rights

14. Under the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) and The Data Protection Act 2018 (DPA) you have a number of rights with regard to your personal data. You have the right to request from us access to and rectification or erasure of your personal data, the right to restrict processing, object to processing as well as in certain circumstances the right to data portability.
15. If you have provided consent for the processing of your data you have the right (in certain

circumstances) to withdraw that consent at any time which will not affect the lawfulness of the processing before your consent was withdrawn.

16. You have the right to lodge a complaint to the Information Commissioners' Office if you believe that we have not complied with the requirements of the GDPR or DPA 18 with regard to your personal data.

Identity and contact details of controller and data protection officer

17. Groundwork Yorkshire is the controller and processor of data for the purposes of the DPA 18 and GDPR.
