Groundwork Northamptonshire are part of a Federation of Groundwork Trusts across England, Wales and Northern Ireland. We work together on federation

wide matters and our Trust is represented at the UK Executive Board. As a larger charity in the area and currently responsible for supporting the wider VCSE sector in Corby and Kettering and the ICS (Integrated Care System), we also have the role as accountable body for Made with Many (Arts Council Funded Programme) and KHL Big Local. Our last audited accounts saw a turnover of 1.4 million pounds, with a similar pattern forecast for the next three years.
