- The course is led by a great set of tutors who build confidence, develop soft skills and coach young people towards their career of choice
- The programme includes interactions with the working world; with mock interviews, work experience placements and community events. Wherever possible, we like our business

Help young people learn life skills outdoors

Forest School provides opportunities for children who don't engage well in a traditional setting to learn new skills & experience the natural environment. Our Level 3 qualified Forest School practitioners partner with local schools to arrange provision for those who need it the most.

- Forest School is a long term intervention, working with young people one day a fortnight for a full academic year
- Forest School is delivered in small groups of no more than 10 young people
- > Young people work towards achieving a John Muir award, completing tasks and learning new skills throughout the year

Help a young person reach their potential

Groundwork's youth workers deliver bespoke 1-2-1 support to young people aged 11-18, providing them with the skills and confidence to reach their potential.

We work with young people who are disengaged, or at risk of disengaging, from education or other mainstream services for around 24 weeks.

Several of our funded programmes come to an end in 2023, however several of the young people we are supporting require further support.

Help someone access emergency heating

Groundwork's Energywork's team support households in Greater Manchester to move out of fuel poverty, so everyone can live warm and well in their home.

Green Doctor's often encounter homes with no fuel or heat source, meaning residents are without heating, hot water and cooking facilities.

Although we work with utility partners to fast track these homes back into full use this process can take several days. To minimise the effects during this time we provide small measures such as oil filled radiators, kettles and air fryers.

With your support we can ensure more homes have the emergency measures they need.

Volunteer with the Working Wardrobe team

Working Wardrobe provides employment advice and a capsule wardrobe to people who are entering employment.

Community Action Day – West Gorton Postcode Gardener

Our Postcode Gardeners are local gardening experts who work with residents to co-create and care for spaces local to them – from hosting volunteering and training sessions and teaching growing skills – they bring people together and bring back nature to urban environments.

This project covers Ardwick, Gorton and Longsight. Activities include:

- Planting trees, bulbs, perennials and wildflowers to improve biodiversity attracting bees, butterflies and other insects
- Carrying out pollinator surveys and bioblitzes to identify plants, insects and understand more about the nature around us
- Creating and maintaining spaces to grow food and provide places for local communities to come together
- Greening streets and alleyways for community use

Groundwork Greater Manchester own and manage over 22 hectares of land within Greater Manchester across 5 nature sites.

Greenspaces are essential assets in urban areas, helping improve the health and wellbeing of local people, providing refuge for native wildlife and helping manage the effects of climate change.

However, maintaining 22 hectares of land to remain accessible to the public year-round and a safe space for native species is a challenging task.

 > We rely on the support of our corporate partners to keep our greenspaces thriving.
 Through a combination of financial donations and the help of volunteers on our Nature Away
 Days we can ensure these greenspaces thrive.



Nature Away Day Seasonal Activities

Over the next few months volunteers will help us:

Tackle Invasive Species

Volunteers will remove invasive plants like ivy and Himalayan balsam to prevent them from outcompeting native species, promote healthier growth, and enhance biodiversity for local wildlife and flora.

Create Dead Hedges and Wildlife Habitats

Volunteers will help build dead hedges, creating essential habitats that provide shelter and nesting spaces for birds and mammals, as well as food for insects. As the hedges decompose, they enrich the soil, benefiting the entire ecosystem.

Restore Pond Ecosystems

Through volunteer efforts in pond management, such as removing overgrown plants and debris, aquatic life is given the opportunity to thrive, maintaining a healthy ecosystem throughout the year.

Revitalize Our Nature Sites

Volunteers will assist in clearing scrub and overgrowth around the sites, making the area more accessible and promoting healthier growth, ensuring a successful nature haven for wildlife and people.

Improve Fishing Pegs and Boardwalks

Volunteers will play a crucial role in maintaining fishing pegs and boardwalks, ensuring our nature sites remain safe and accessible for all visitors.
